SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM 2012-2013

The San Antonio Transportation Association Scholarship program was established to support members and deserving children of members in attaining a higher education. Student members enrolled in approved logistics and transportation education programs are eligible for the Paul Rhoades Memorial Scholarship. Awards are presented on May 2, 2012.

SATA Scholarships are open to members and children of members (natural, adopted, or step-child). Qualified SATA member / sponsors: (1) are current in their membership dues; (2) will have participated in at least three meetings and / or SATA bowling or golf events between September 2011 and the end of March 2012. (3) The applicant must complete all requirements listed below and, (4) submit the completed scholarship application form in person or by mail to the Scholarship Chairperson **ON or BEFORE APRIL 4, 2012**. Mailed (USPS) applications should be posted before midnight, April 4, 2012.

ESSAY GUIDELINES: Applicants, please note there are two essays offered. All work must be your own. If you are entering college or you are enrolled in a non-logistics program, respond to Essay A. Your essay should be about 250-300 words, and suggested guidelines follow. Member applicants enrolled in Logistics studies must choose Essay B.

Essay A: Topic for new college students or students in non-logistics programs:

- (1) Describe in general terms, your understanding of your sponsor's (your dad or mom's) work in the transportation, logistics, and supply chain industry and how they support the transportation association.
- (2) Describe your college goals and objectives.
- (3) Describe two of your achievements or accomplishments this past year. What did you do and what were the results of your actions?
- (4) Give an example of something you learned in the past year that confirms and supports (or has changed) your original goal and objectives.
- (5) Briefly describe your total expected college expenses including tuition, books, housing, and other expenses & fees.
- (6) Finally, please check to be sure that: (a) your information is accurate and complete; (b) you have demonstrated a writing style relative to your education level; (c) you have followed directions.

Essay B: Topic for members enrolled in Logistics & Supply Chain Management Studies

- (1) Briefly, tell us about yourself. Include a brief synopsis of your work history and achievements. Include your personal goals and objectives in the logistics - transportation field.
- (2) Describe what you believe to be the most important issue facing the transportation industry in the United States today. What specific economic, political, or social problems does this issue present on a micro or macro level? What actions, in your opinion, would help resolve the issue, and why?
- (3) In what way will your membership in SATA and this scholarship help you achieve your goals?

We strive to reveal no identifying information including SSN, sponsor names, school id's, etc. We ask however, that you initial each page in the upper right hand corner. This helps keep your pages together when duplicating your work for the committee. We destroy all copies after the application process is completed. Include a sase if you want your originals returned.

1. Write your initials in top right hand corner of each page.
2. Provide a complete set of transcripts containing your student ID number in accordance with the guide lines stated below. "For Student Only" electronic mail copies are not accepted, but on-line print outs with the official college logo are acceptable. You have the option to submit your current semester's unofficial standings in addition to your previous semester's official transcript, if you prefer. College Transcript(s) should show 3 or more semester hours of satisfactorily completed work at a regionally accredited college or university. If you have not yet completed your first semester, a student copy of a transcript showing current, on-going progress may be submitted if it contains the name of school, logo, and date of access. Printout date must appear on the form.

HIGH SCHOOL APPLICANTS: Submit GED certificate or high school transcripts showing at least 3 ½ years of satisfactorily completed work in high school and ACT or SAT scores. Include International Baccalaureate Program Credit Evaluations (IBP) and/or Advance Placement Program scores (AP) if available.

In addition to both Essay A, and Essay B, be sure you have addressed the following. You may include a separate page to list courses and hours you plan to take in the fall (Soc II, Psych I, etc.), along with the estimated tuition and fees per course/hour, housing and books. Submit an estimated total. (We do not need precise numbers.) We would like to determine if you have an appreciation of your or your family's investment. Do not submit a cost per credit list without your written interpretation of the same. We will not do the math for you.

"My signature certifies that all the information I am providing in this application for consideration of a SATA Scholarship is, to the best of my knowledge, true and accurate and that the essay is essentially my own work."
